The focus for today is: Jesus is compassionate and merciful to all who call upon him. Who among us would not welcome a miracle? While we can look back in time and see the miracles of the past, it may not be so easy to see those in our own day. It takes faith to be able to recognize miracles. It requires taking time out of our busy schedules to pray and contemplate God's actions in our world. There are miracles occurring today, we have only to believe in order to see.

Our first reading tells us that God created life, not death, and that all of creation is wholesome. Saint Paul encourages the Corinthians to share their abundance, just as Jesus shared his life for their salvation. Saint Mark's passage relates two stories: Jesus healing the woman with hemorrhages and raising the daughter of the synagogue official from the dead.
