### Why Ordinary Time can also be called the "season of saints"

Ordinary Time has a primary focus on the years of ministry of  
Jesus Christ and the need for growth and maturation in the life  
of the Christian. Connected to this spiritual theme is the  
"universal call to holiness," and a particular focus during  
Ordinary Time on the celebration of saints' feast days.

In the Catholic Church's calendar, the seasons of Advent,  
Christmas, Lent and Easter all have easily identifiable  
themes connected to the life of Christ. The season  
known as "Ordinary Time," on the other hand, is often  
thought to be a "general" season with no particular  
focus.

In reality, Ordinary Time has a primary focus on the years  
of ministry of Jesus Christ and the need for growth and  
maturation in the life of the Christian. This is one reason  
why green was chosen for this season, symbolizing the  
need for growth.
